

# Feedback sought on medicine take-back plan



Medicine take-back programs provide a secure and environmentally-sound way to dispose of leftover or expired medicines, and are a part of a comprehensive approach to preventing prescription drug abuse.

In December 2016, the Kitsap Public Health Board adopted regulations that would make medication disposal safe, available, convenient and free for Kitsap residents.
