What you need to know about COVID-19 in Kitsap County.



KEY UPDATES

The number of COVID-19 cases reported in Kitsap County ticked up slightly last week, with 114 cases reported compared with 76 the week prior. Increases were reported in most areas of the county. Hospitalizations among Kitsap residents continue to fall. Four new hospitalizations were reported last week, compared to 15 the prior week.

A second booster shot is now recommended for some community members, including:

- Everyone 50 and older who received their first booster at least four months ago.
- Anyone 12 and older who is moderately to severely immunocompromised
- Anyone 18 and older who received primary and booster doses of Johnson & Johnson vaccine at least four months ago.
