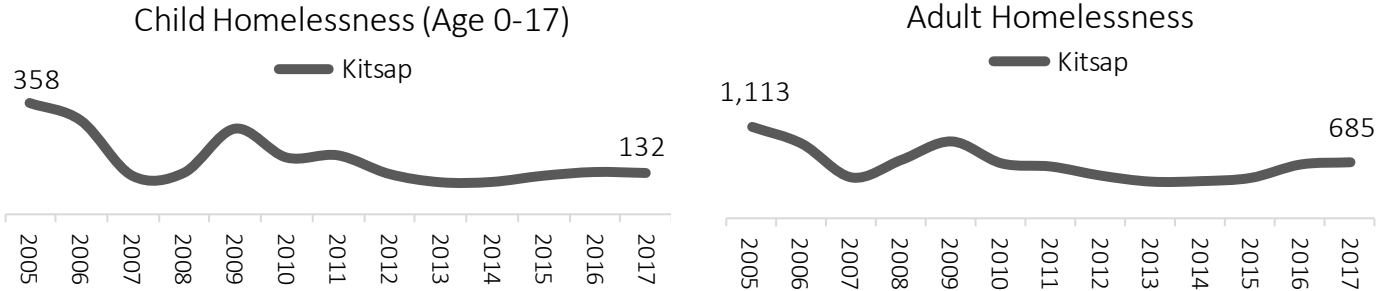
Priority 3: Affordable Housing

Increase affordable housing and make homelessness a one-time brief event

Homelessness Characteristics & Impact

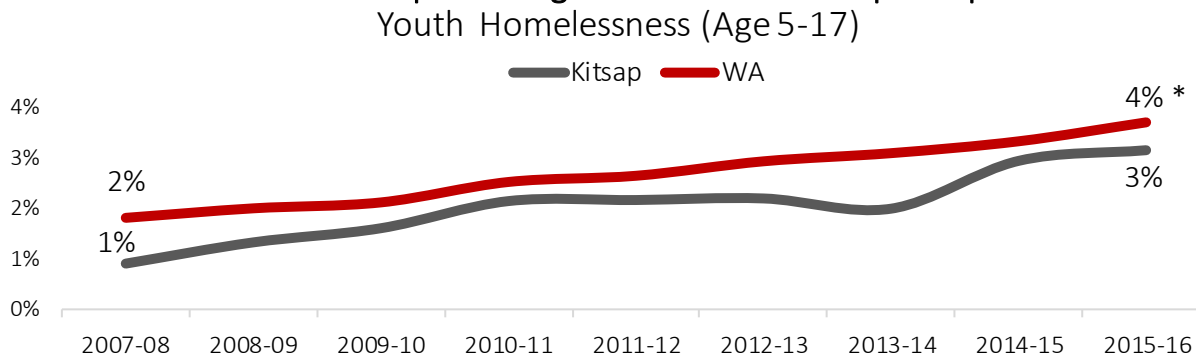
Homelessness can occur due to individual factors (e.g. substance abuse) and/or structural factors (e.g. unaffordable housing).¹ People experiencing homelessness are at a higher risk for experiencing mental health disorders, infectious diseases, injuries, morbidity, and mortality.¹

In emergency or transitional shelter, unsheltered, or temporarily living with family or friends.

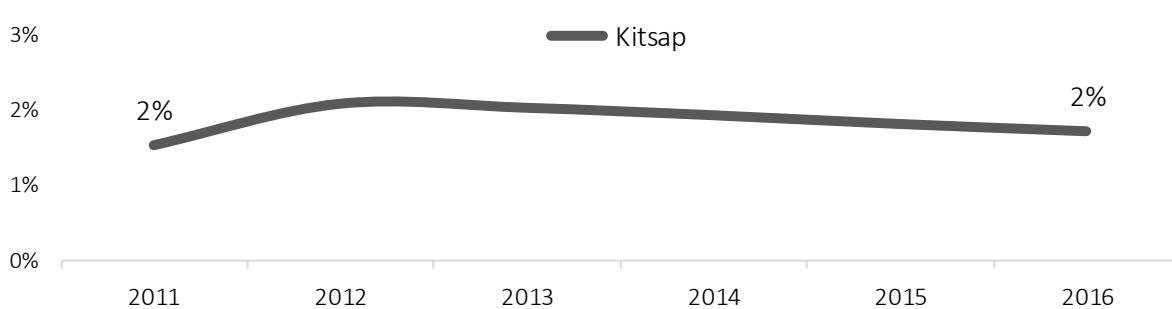
OSPI Count of Youth Experiencing Homelessness: Kitsap Compared to WA³

In a shelter, doubled-up, unsheltered, or in a hotel/motel.

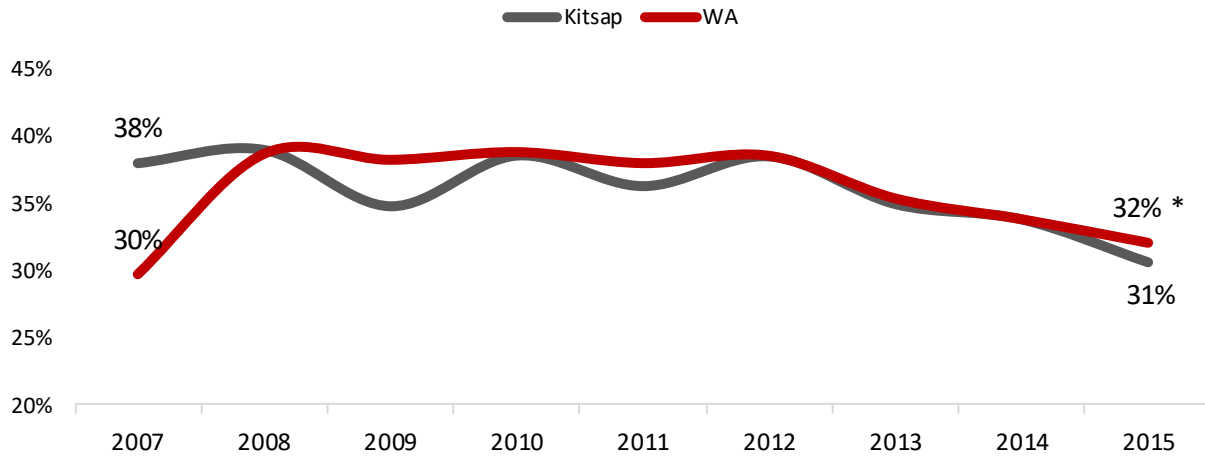
Kitsap County HMIS Count of Individuals Experiencing Homelessness⁴

Housing Affordability: Kitsap Compared to WA⁵

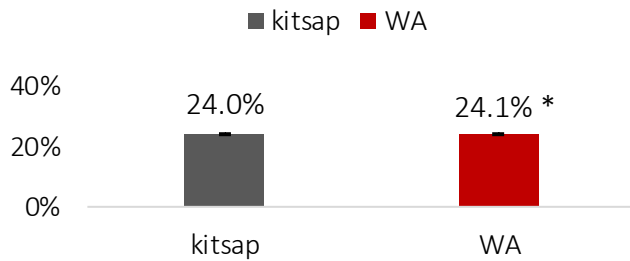
People Paying 30% or More of Monthly Income on Housing



* Statistically significantly higher

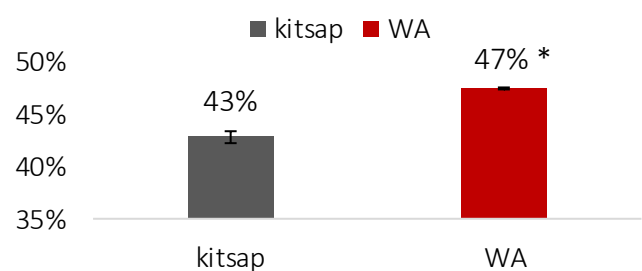
Housing Affordability by Type: Kitsap Compared to WA⁵
