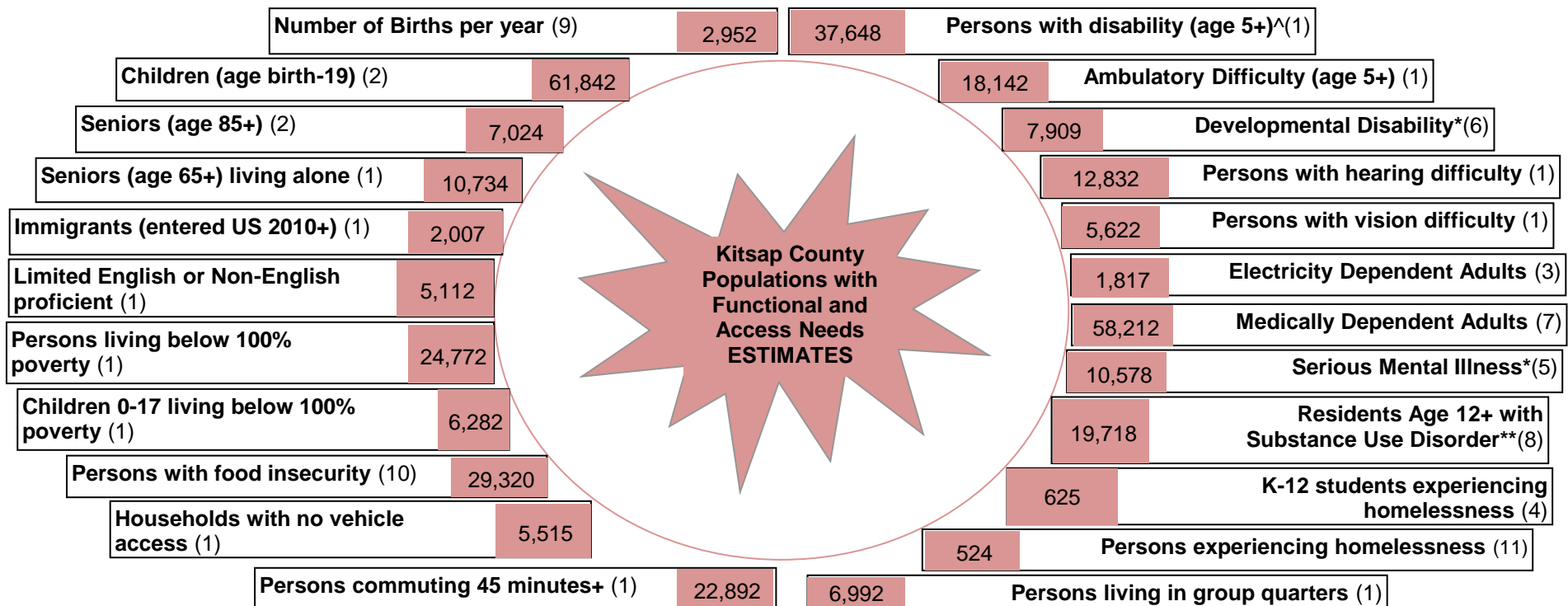


Kitsap County Populations with Functional and Access Needs Estimates (Updated Dec 2020)

The Kitsap Populations with Functional and Access Needs Report is designed to provide estimated numbers of people in populations who might need additional assistance or have special needs in an emergency situation or unforeseen event. These estimates, while originally compiled for emergency preparedness planning, can also be used for other health or community planning work.

Categories of Populations with Functional and Access Needs

Residents Age 12+ with Substance Use Disorder: Residents age 12+ diagnosed with substance use disorder in the past year based on Washington State estimates from the National Survey of Drug Use and Health

Children:

Children (age birth-19): Persons 19 years or younger

Number of Births per year: number of births in a given year

Electricity Dependent Adults: Total number of Medicare beneficiaries with claims in the prior month for: a ventilator, BiPAP, internal feeding, IV infusion pump, suction pump, at-home dialysis, electric wheelchair; claims in the past 13 months for electric bed equipment; claims in the past 36 months for oxygen concentrator equipment; and claims in the past 5 years for an implanted cardiac device.

Homeless or Shelter Dependent:

Persons living in group quarters: Population living in group quarters (college residence halls, residential treatment centers, skilled nursing facilities, group homes, military barracks, correctional facilities, workers' dormitories and facilities for people experiencing homelessness)

Persons experiencing homelessness: Homeless persons surveyed during a 24-hour period for the annual Point In Time count

K-12 students experiencing homelessness: Population in kindergarten through 12th grade who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence

Households with no vehicle access: Households reporting no vehicle available

Immigrants (entered US 2010+): Persons reporting being born in a foreign country and having arrived in the US in 2010 or later

Impoverished:

Persons living below 100% of poverty: Persons living in households with past 12 month income below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Children 0-17 living below 100% of poverty: Persons 17 years or younger living in households with past 12 month income below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Limited English or Non-English Proficient: Population age 5+ speaking language other than English at home and speaking English less than "very well"

Medically Dependent Adults: Adults age 18 and older with at least one of the following chronic conditions: asthma, diabetes, myocardial infarction, or angina

Persons commuting 45 minutes+: Of those who work at least some time during the week and report working outside their home, person who spend at least 45 minutes getting to work, including time spent waiting for public transportation, picking up carpool passengers and other activities related to getting to work

Persons living with a disability:

Persons with vision difficulty: Population that reports vision loss: serious difficulty seeing even when wearing glasses or contact lenses; blind or unable to see at all

Persons with hearing difficulty: Population that reports serious difficulty hearing without a hearing aid; deaf or unable to hear at all

Developmental Disability: Kitsap population aged 3 through 17 years with at least 1 impairment in physical, learning, language or behavior that began during the developmental period may impact day-to-day functioning and usually lasts throughout a person's lifetime; extrapolated from US population averages

Ambulatory Difficulty: Population age 5 and older with conditions that cause serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs

Persons with disability (age 5+): Population age 5 and older with hearing, vision, cognitive, ambulatory, self-care and independent living difficulties

Persons with food insecurity: Persons with a lack of access, at times, to enough food for an active, healthy life for all household members and limited or uncertain availability of nutritionally adequate foods, according to the USDA's measure of food insecurity

Seniors:

Seniors (age 85+): Population age 85 and older

Seniors (age 65+) living alone: Persons age 65 and older who live alone

Serious Mental Illness: Kitsap population age 18 and older who experience disability due to serious mental illness; extrapolated from US population averages
